It is with mixed emotions that we celebrate the retirement of Dr. Terry Minuk. Terry joined the Henderson Hospital (now Juravinski) in 1983. Since Terry's recruitment, his contributions to the hospital, patients, breast imaging programs and larger radiologist community have been highly impactful. Terry is one of the founding breast imagers in Ontario, participating in breast imaging work and imaging studies since his recruitment. He was an instrumental radiologist in establishing the highly successful OBSP site in Hamilton, participating as a breast radiologist in the program from 1991 to 2019. Terry served as the Radiology Coordinator for the OBSP Central West Region from 2008 to 2012 and was the long time Regional Breast Imaging Lead in our LHIN from 2012 to 2019. He contributed, advocated and shared in the success of the Breast Assessment Centre at the Juravinski site. Terry also served as the Site Chief for the Juravinski Hospital from 1998 to 2008.

Many technologists, nurses and fellow staff radiologist gained from working side by side with Terry. He was always an enthusiastic teacher and passionate advocate for patients. He loved nothing more than teaching residents and clinical fellows, often noting that they were the reason he loved coming to work each day. His patients experienced and commented on his caring nature, good humour and excellent skills. Terry was always available to provide a helping hand to support his colleagues. A close friend to many and treasured radiologist team member, we wish Terry all the best in this next important phase of his life. He will be dearly missed!



In order to do so, FHS must understand the compositional diversity and cultural experiences of its faculty and staff to build and support the continuously developing attitudes, knowledge and skills which fosters a culture of respect, inclusion and a sense of belonging for all.

#### The FHS Diversity and Climate Survey has been developed for exactly this purpose.

Currently, the Department of Radiology completion rate is 11.41% which is ranked #17 within the Faculty of Health Sciences. I strongly encourage each and every individual to set aside up to 15 minutes to complete the FHS Diversity & Climate Survey before June 30, 2022. Individuals who complete the Survey are eligible to enter into a separate draw to win 1 of 20 bursaries totaling \$500.00 towards continuing professional development of your choice.

About the FHS Diversity & Climate Survey:

FHS Diversity & Climate Survey is <u>separate</u> from McMaster's Diversity Count Census; <u>both are important to complete</u>

Responses are *anonymous* and *confidential* 

Survey responses are stored **separate** from participant data

Survey responses are reported in <u>aggregate</u> when minimum reporting requirements are not met (your responses will <u>not</u> be identifiable in any way)

Survey responses and bursary entrant data is <u>stored separately</u>; the CPD Bursary Award entry is a <u>completely separate survey</u> which is <u>voluntary</u> to complete

We thank all those who have taken the time to provide insights on their experiences within the Faculty of Health Sciences and we look <u>forward to sharing the results with our FHS Community.</u>
