This message is for faculty and staff of the Faculty of Health Sciences from Paul O'Byrne, Dean and Vice-President

Last week, McMaster University provided <u>an update</u> on fall plans, in line with the latest COVID-19 safety guidance from public health, the Ontario government, and our own faculty experts in virology and immunology and other health fields.

I want to share an update for the Faculty of Health Sciences, particularly as there continue to be differences depending on where you are working in person.

As indicated in the university update, McMaster's academic and community hospitals and other health care facilities continue to have their own COVID policies and protocols and these must be followed by faculty, staff and learners who attend these locations.

The hospitals and healthcare facilities continue the requirement to wear a medical mask while indoors.

On McMaster campus, masks are strongly recommended in any indoor spaces that are shared with other people. McMaster campus includes the Health Sciences Library and Ewart Angus Centre areas of the Health Sciences Centre.

As I said in June, St. Joseph's Healthcare Hamilton and Hamilton Health Sciences are no longer requiring active daily screening for COVID-19 by staff, physicians and learners entering their hospitals. McMaster is also no longer requiring daily screening through MacCheck. However, everyone should use the <u>provincial self-assessment screening tool</u> if you or someone you live with has symptoms or tests positive for COVID. Staff and faculty members must continue to report confirmed cases of COVID through Mosaic, as required by provincial workplace regulations.

The university continues to monitor the situation closely and update the <u>covid19.mcmaster.ca</u> website.

As previously noted, if pandemic circumstances and public health advice shifts and government requirements change, the university may need to quickly reinstate a mask requirement and a vaccine policy. Everyone is still encouraged to keep up to date with their COVID vaccinations and <u>MacCheck</u> now offers the ability to upload proof of vaccination documentation for up to four doses. Learners who have direct contact with patients must remain compliant with the Faculty of Health Sciences' <u>Health Screening Requirements</u>.

I continue to be incredibly proud of all we have accomplished at the Faculty of Health Sciences in responding to the pandemic in proactive, innovative and collaborative ways, maintaining our high quality learning, discovery and care.

Thank you, everyone, for your dedication and conscientious support of all those in our FHS community, and in the broader community that we support.
